A Regular Meeting of the Christopher Kohl's District Governing Board convened on Tuesday, February 23, 2016 at 3:00 pm at the Fire Station 51 Community Room.

BUSINESS

Item #3 Approval of Minutes

A. The Board reviewed the minutes of the Regular Meeting of January 19, 2016 Tom James made a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of January 19, 2016 with correction of "suggestions made" to replace "legal advice". Steve Sundra seconded the motion. **Vote Results:**

Item # 4 Reports and Correspondence

A. Chief's Report

Chief Lockhart reviewed call volume, brush loads, public assistance, mileage, and training for January. Chief Lockhart purchased tires for E526 for \$1700. The department has received \$1285 in donations in memory of Mimi Tidwell. Steve Sundra asked if the department "exercised" vehicles that are seldom in use. This will be a future agenda item. Hazardous Fuels Grant #15-209 has been put out for bid. Bids will be opened February 22, 2016 at 10:00 am. Ben Perry will supervise the work on this grant. 50% of payment will be retained until work is finished to satisfaction. Work has begun on the 2016/17 budget. Chief Lockhart will hold one budget workshop. Two Wildland Invoices totaling \$37,248.93 have been submitted to and approved by the state. Payment should be received in March.

Chief Lockhart discussed the recent Uphill Fire at length. Response to the fire was complicated by the extreme slope and icy conditions of Uphill Road. Chad St Luka's decision to move the operation to Coffee Lane was wise. Our two-man crew, Chad St Luka and Jason Tutay, along with volunteers, Dale Ashby and Dave Elston, did an amazing job of evaluating and controlling the fire until mutual aid arrived. Payson and Hellsgate both sent three pieces of equipment and command officers. Forest Lakes sent a four-man engine. Chief Lockhart opted to keep Chad St Luka in command of the operation and Chad did an outstanding job. Damage was confined to the original structure, with some damage to the neighboring property. Chief Lockhart appreciates the positive newspaper coverage, editorial, and letters to the editor. Chairman Dawson asked the Chief to prepare formal letters or certificates of accommodation for Chad St Luka, Jason Tutay, Dale Ashby, and Dave Elston.

Steve Sundra mentioned that Gila County has installed new signs on Colcord Road in lieu of guardrails. Chief Lockhart reported on two ballot items that may be before voters on May 15. The revision of PSPRS (Public Safety Retirement) is expected to pass. The removal of tax levy caps may not be as successful. For more information see the attached Chief's Report.

B. Financial Officers Report

A. Financial Officer, Jeff Daniels, read the financial report for January. The Enterprise Account balance is high. Linda Digman suggested transferring some funds from the Enterprise Account to the Capital Account. Karen Thornton moved to approve the January Financial Report. John Digman reported that the repair of Engine 511 will not exceed the agreed upon amount. Repair of this engine has encountered multiple problems with oil pump and fuel pump failures. However, it should be ready for service in five business days.

NEW BUSINESS

Item #2 Discussion and possible action including review and approval of Policies and Procedures for Wildland Assignments.

Chief Lockhart discussed the formulas and methods of billing for Off-District Wildland Fire Response and Wages. He has researched and written policies and procedures for wildland assignments. This will enable the district to have a standard procedure governing wildland assignments and wages. The Board suggested several grammatical corrections to the proposal. Karen Thornton moved that the Board accept (with suggested changes) the new Policy and Procedure 30.14 Off District Wildland Fire Response/Wages, Section 30:00 Compensation/Administration to become effective March1, 2016. Steve Sundra seconded the motion.
